- Sign up at ONE.org.
- Tell your friends and family to sign up at ONE.org.
- Take the urgent actions that arrive via email.
- Forward urgent action emails to your friends and family.

**THE ONE BLOG**

The ONE Blog is a daily log of the movement to fight extreme poverty. By reading the blog everyday, you'll receive the most up-to-date information and get to know ONE members from all over the country.

- Subscribe to the ONE Blog via the "subscribe" link on the top right column of the blog.
- Join the conversation by writing comments on the posts.
- Contribute posts for the ONE Blog through your Regional ONE Field Organizer.

## **YAHOO GROUPS: GET INVOLVED LOCALLY**

- Sign up for your local ONE group through the Yahoo Groups section on the front page of ONE.org (or create a group if one doesn't already exist in your area.)
- Write messages to other members in the group. Work with each other and your local Regional ONE Field Organizer to make smart, strategic local plans.

## **USE SOCIAL NETWORKING SITES**

Social networking sites are becoming more popular everyday and people discover new ways to organize on them all the time. The two listed below, Facebook and MySpace, are just two of many examples. - Facebook
  - Create a Facebook account ([www.facebook.com](http://www.facebook.com)).
  - Join the official Global ONE Facebook Group (<http://facebook.com/group.php?gid=2204492158>).
  - Join or create a local ONE Facebook group for your school or region.
  - Use Facebook's tools (such as events, messaging, discussion boards, wall postings and the news share features) to organize your local Facebook group for ONE.
- MySpace
  - Create a MySpace account ([www.myspace.com](http://www.myspace.com)).
  - Join the official ONE MySpace Group and find updates, photos, videos and comments from fellow ONE members ([www.myspace.com/theonecampaign](http://www.myspace.com/theonecampaign)).
